

Disc Function or Operation that is Not Available





Title, Chapter and Tracks

DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.

• Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song on an Audio CD. Example: Audio CD



CONNECTING TO A TV

Connecting to a TV

Use the VIDEO/AUDIO/S-VIDEO cable to connect your TV to the Unit.



Notes :

- When you connect the Unit to your TV, be sure to turn off the power and unplug both units from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- Connect the Unit to your TV directly. If you connect the DVD player to a VTR, TV/VTR combination or video selector, the playback picture may be distorted as DVD discs are copy protected.

Cautions

- To prevent electrical shock, match wide blade of plug to wide slot, fully insert.
- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- When you are not going to use the Unit for a long period of time, disconnect the AC power cord.

Turning on the Unit and TV

- 1)Press the 1/0 button to turn the Unit ON.
- 2)Press the U/POWER or FUNCTION button on the remote control to turn on the Unit or press the ► PLAY button on the Unit.
- 3)Turn on the TV by pressing its **POWER/OPERATE** button.
- 4)Select the channel on your TV corresponding to the video input you connected the appliance to. See TV User guide for more information.
 - If you have connected the appliance successfully, the DVD logo (start-up picture) will appear on your TV screen.








SPEAKER CONNECTIONS

Surround Speakers Connections

Ensure in each case that the **TRANSPARENT (+)** wire is connected to the **(+)** terminal of the surround speaker output and the **TRANSPARENT (-)** wire with black line is connected to the **(-)** terminal of the surround speaker output. Also ensure that the correct orientation for left and right main speakers is observed.

Subwoofer Connection

Connect the wires with the **TRANSPARENT (+)** wire to the red **(+)** terminal and the **TRANSPARENT (-)** wire with black line to the black **(-)** terminal.

ADJUSTING THE SOUND

To adjust the surround sound balance while Pro Logic decoding is in effect

Use the remote control to make the following changes to speaker balance:

Front speaker (left)

 Press the SOUND button to display LEFT, then press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

Front speaker (right)

• Press the **SOUND** button to display RIGHT, then press the **▼** or **▲** CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

Center speaker

 Press the SOUND button to display CENTRE, then press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

Rear speaker (left)

 Press the SOUND button to display REAR L, then press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

Rear speaker (right)

 Press the SOUND button to display REAR R, then press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

Subwoofer

 Press the SOUND button to display WOOFER, then press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the Unit.

To adjust the sound quality

Press the **SOUND** button to select an equalization mode (**BASS**, **MIDDLE**, **TREBLE**). Press the ▼ or ▲ CURSOR button to adjust the sound level.

BASS : the low range of sounds

MIDDLE : the mid range of sounds

TREBLE : the high range of sounds

Dolby Pro Logic is a decoding system that was developed to get a better sense of presence from sources encoded with Dolby Surround. The feeling of position has been improved by the addition of a separate center speaker channel. Look for this logo on your DVD Unit.





Region (Local) Number Error Indicator

If the region (local) number of the disc that you attempt to play differs from the region number of the Unit "Invalid Region" appears on the TV screen. (The disc cannot be played).

REMOTE CONTROL UNIT



1) POWER / 🕛 button

Turns the Unit power on and puts it in standby mode.

2) Number (0 - 9) and (+10) buttons

Use when creating programs, and entering a parental level password. To select preset stations over 9, press +10 button and then the second no. for example, to enter 18, press +10 and then 8.

3) SOUND button

Selects an equalization mode.

4) VOLUME (+ / -) buttons

Adjust the volume to your desired level.

5) $\blacktriangle / \lor CURSOR$ buttons

Use to highlight selections on a menu screen and make adjustments of the Unit settings.

6) FUNCTION (FCN) button

Display the FUNCTION screen where you can check or change various setting.

7) **II** PAUSE button

Pause playback.

8) I PREV / NEXT ►► / - PRESET + buttons

Move reverse or forward through disc titles, chapters or tracks on a disc.

Open and close DVD's menu.



LOADING THE BATTERIES

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- Point the Remote Control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the Unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

TO INSTALL BATTERIES

1.Open the battery door.



2. Insert two "AA" or UM-3 size batteries.



BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When batteries become weak, the operating distance of the Remote Control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

Notes:

- If the Remote Control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.

PLAYING A DISC

BASIC PLAYBACK

Preparations

- When you want to view a disc, turn on the TV and select the video input connected to the Unit.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and select the input connected to the Unit.
- Adjust the VOLUME or SOUND control to your desired level. (See ADJUSTING THE SOUND)

1.Press the 1/ \oplus button on the front panel, the \oplus indicator lights up.

- 2. Then press the ⁽⁾/POWER or FUNCTION button on the remote to turn on the Unit, or press the ► PLAY or FUNCTION button on the front panel to turn on the Unit.
- 3. Press the ▲ OPEN / CLOSE button. The disc tray opens.
- 4. Place the disc on the disc tray with the label (side 1 or side 2) side up .
- 5. Press the
 OPEN / CLOSE button. The disc tray closes.
- 6. Press the ► PLAY button.

It takes a short while for your Unit to load the disc. After loading, the Unit will automatically start playback the disc.

To interrupt playback

Press the **II PAUSE** button and "**II PAUSE**" indicator displays on the screen. Press the ► **PLAY** button to resume playback.

To stop playback

Press the ■ **STOP** button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the ▶ **PLAY** button. Press the ■ **STOP** button twice, the Unit's memory will be cleared.

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this DVD Unit. Some DVD discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. As such, the DVD Unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the DVD Unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" \bigotimes " may appear on the TV screen during operation. A " \bigotimes " means that the operation is not permitted by DVD Unit or the disc.

Selecting the picture enhancement

1. Press the SETUP button during playback.

- 2.Use ▲ or ▼ button to Brightness, and then press the ENTER button to select On / Off.
 On : Picture will be raised brightness to clarify details.
 - Off : Picture will be deepened colors.
- 3.Use ▲ or ▼ button to Edges and press the ENTER button to select the Sharpen / Soften / Off.
 Sharpen : Fine detail will be easier to see
 Soften : Soft-focus effect.
 - Off : Picture will be returned to normal.
- **4.** If you want to exit the SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the **RETURN** button.

Note:

 Actual effect to pictures may vary depending on the TV.

- Use the ▲ OPEN / CLOSE button on the front panel to open or close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray or you may damage the Unit.
- Let the disc tray open completety before removing the disc. Press the **OPEN / CLOSE** button to close the disc tray after you remove the disc.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

- **1.**Press the **FWD** → or **◄ REV** button when a disc is playing.
- The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.



• Four speeds are available. Each time **FWD** ► or **◄ REV** button is pressed, the speed of fast scan changes in the following sequence:

2. Press the **PLAY** button when you reach the desired point.

Slow-motion play

1. Press the SLOW I► or **<I** SLOW button in the play mode.

• Two speeds are available. Each time **SLOW** I► or **<I SLOW** button is pressed, the speed of slow-motion playback changes in the following sequence:

2. Press the ► PLAY button to return to the normal playback speed.


SKIP (Forward / Reverse)

While you are playing a disc, press the ►►I NEXT button of the remote or ►►I SKIP button of front panel to move to the beginning of the next chapter. Press the I<< PREV button of the remote or I<< SKIP button of the front panel to move to the previous chapter and automatically start playing that chapter.

Zooming into an image

While a disc is playing, press the **ZOOM** button.

• While an image is zoomed, you can use ▲, ▼, ◀ and ► button to shift the view and display the part you want.



Basic playback

Notes:

- This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, 🚫 is displayed.

Notes :

- If only one audio format is recorded, the number does not change.
- About two seconds later, p l a y b a c k continues in the new audio format.

Angle selection

Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles. (The recorded angles differ depending on the disc used.)


1. While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the **ANGLE** button to view the number of the current angle.

MAINTENANCE

CLEANING DISC

- A defective or soiled disc inserted into the Unit can cause sound to drop out during playback.
- Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.
- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do not use irregular shape discs (example : heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.

CLEANING THE UNIT

- Be sure to turn the Unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the Unit.
- Wipe the Unit with a dry soft cloth.

If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a week soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, then wipe with a dry cloth.


• Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. And do not use compressed air to remove dust.

Before transporting the Unit, remove all discs from the CD tray.

Guidelines of Playing MP3 files

This unit will play MP3 files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.

Playing a MP3 file disc

- **1.** Press the **△OPEN /CLOSE** button, the disc tray opens.
- **2.** Insert a MP3 file disc on the disc tray with the label side up.
- **3.** Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button, the disc tray closes.
- 4. The unit will take a short while to load the disc and automatically playback.

To pause playback

• Press the ■PAUSE button. To resume playback again, press the ►PLAY button.

To stop playback

• Press the **STOP** button.

To skip to the next or previous file

- Press the ►►INEXT button of the remote control or ►►ISKIP button of the front panel briefly while playing, to skip ahead to the beginning of the next file. Each time you press the button consecutively, the beginning of the next file is located and played back.
- Press the IMM PREV (Previous) button of the remote control or IMM SKIP button of the front panel briefly while playing, to skip back to the beginning of the previous file. Each time you press the button consecutively, the beginning of the previous files is located and played back.

On-Screen Display

Turn on your TV to view the on-screen display of MP3 files.

- **1.** Press the **MENU** button of the remote control to view in DIR (directory) folders name.
- Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ CURSOR button of the remote control to select the folder, then press ENT (Enter) button to confirm.
- **3.** Press the ▲, ▼, ◀ or ► CURSOR button of the remote control to select the file you want to listen to, then press **ENT** (Enter) button and this selected file is located and played back.

Notes:

The ability of this unit to read MP3 discs is dependent on the following:

- The Bit Rate must be within 64 256 kbps.
- The total number of files on the disc should not exceed 254.
- The maximum number of directories should not exceed 32.
- The maximum depth level of directories should not exceed 4.
- File names should be named using 8 or fewer letters and/or numbers, and must incorporate the "MP3" file extension. EXAMPLE: *******.MP3 where each * is a letter or number.
- Use only letters and / or numbers in file names. If you use special characters, the file and/or folder names may not be displayed correctly on the on-screen display.
- When recording on CD-R discs, use 74-minute (650M) discs. Do NOT use 80-minute (700M) discs.
- The CD-R or CD-RW discs should be "finalized" in computer by "single section format".

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
