


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

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# Before you begin

### **Power supply**

This unit can be operated by 2 AAA batteries or 3V DC power supply.

# Installing Batteries (not included)

1. Slide the battery compartment door to the bottom and lift up the door to

2. Insert 2 AAA batteries with polarities matching indications.3. Replace the battery compartment door.

Refer to the battery level indicator on display for batteries level. Replace with new batteries when the indicator is empty.



# Using AC/DC adaptor (not included)

Connect the AC/DC adaptor to the DC jack on the unit.
 Connect the AC/DC adaptor to the wall outlet.

# Auto power shut down

The unit will be automatically turned off if left idle for 3 minutes.

# Using headphones and external microphone

- When headphones are connected, sound output from speaker will be muted.
- When external microphone is connected, no record can be made from built-in microphone.

### **Keys lock**

This feature avoids accidental key activation during recording or playback.

1. Press and hold **MENU** button for 2 seconds, LOCKED will be shown on display. (LOCK icon will lit)
2. Press and hold **MENU** button for 2 seconds again to unlock keys.

**Tips**: keys lock function can be activated in any mode.

#### **Tones**

You can activate this feature so that beep sound can be heard whenever you press on any button except during playback and recording.

1. Press **MENU** button repeatedly until **TONE** shows on display.
2. Press **REVERSE** or **FORWARD** to set beep sound ON/ OFF.

# **Setting the time**

### Year/Date/12/24/Time **Setting**

With this function, you can always read on the display the recording date and time of your recorded messages. Follow the steps below for time setting.

You can still use this unit for normal recording without setting the time. However, no correct recording date and time can be referred for your recorded messages and the display will keep flashing when the unit is turned

- 1. Turn on the unit.
- 2. Press **MENU** repeatedly to enter Time setting mode.
- 3. When "YEAR" flashes, the digits of the year blinks (default is 2002). Press **REVERSE** or

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# **Basic operation**

### Manual recording

### Folder selection

### Recording quality(SP/HQ)

You can select between two recording qualitieS. Default is SP. (Refer to Recording quality / condition section (p.10) for details.)

### **Recording condition** (DICT/CONF)

You can select between two recording conditions. Default is DICT. (Refer to Recording quality / condition section (p.10) for details.)

#### Playback mode

You can select to play one file at a time (Play one) or play all files in the folder continuously (Play all). Default is Play one.

### Introscan

You can quick scanning the beginning 3 seconds of each file in a folder. (Refer to page 11 for details)

# **Recording mode**

# EN Setting Recording Mode

You can select between two recording modes - manual recording and AVR (automatic voice recording).

### 1. Manual Recording

# 2. AVR (Automatic Voice Recording)

This feature allows the unit to sense sound and to record only when you are speaking into the microphone. When dictation stops for about 3 seconds, recording will stop and then start again automatically when you resume dictation.

- 1. Select destination folder (1-4).
- 2. Press **MENU**
- three times.
- 3. Press **REVERSE** or **FORWARD** to toggle between AVR on and AVR

off. 4. Press **STOP** to

exit to STOP mode.

5. Press **RECORD** to enter AVR mode.

increase sensitivity value when recording source is far from the unit or the recording envionment is quiet.).
7. Start dictation. Recording starts automatically.
8. Press **STOP** to end AVR recording.

8. Press **STOP** to end AVR recording. 9. Repeat step 2 and select AVR OFF for de-selection.

#### Tips

 The first syllable or two may be lost when you start recording because this 'sound' is used to turn on the AVR feature. It is a good pratice to make some 'sounds' or say a short word to activate the AVR before you begin actual dictation.









# **Recording quality / condition**

### Setting Recording Quality

You can select between two recording qualities. Default is SP.

#### **Definition**

- SP (Standard Play) allows about 160 min recording on RP5010, 320 min on RP5012.
- **HQ** (High Quality) allows about 60 min recording on RP5010, 120 min on RP5012

1. Press MENU
button three times,
(SP or HQ show on display.)
2. Toggle between
SP and HQ by pressing REVERSE or FORWARD.
3. Confirm selection by pressing MENU or STOP button.

# Setting Recording Condition

You can select between two recording conditions. Default is DICT.

#### **Definition**

- CONF (Conference) in a more open area and recording source is far from the unit.
- **DICT** (Dictation) in a more enclosed area and recording source is close to the unit.
- 1. Press **MENU** twice until DICT or CONF show on display.
  2. Select recording condition by pressing **REVERSE** or **FORWARD**.
- 3. Confirm selection by pressing **MENU** button. (You may press **STOP** to exit from further selection.)



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#### Tips:

For conferences, to obtain optimum recording quality, place the recorder with the microphone freely exposed to the sound source as close as convenient. A built-in automatic recording level control will set record level for optimum recordings during manual recording. Avoid recording near unwanted noise sources, such as air conditioners or fans.



# Erasing file / folder

### **Erasing selected file**

- 4. Press and hold **ERASE** to confirm deleting. (or press STOP to cancel erasing file)

Tips: file numbers that come after erased one will be moved forward by one automatically.

### Erasing all files in a folder

You can delete all files in a specific folder by the following steps:

- 1. Turn on the unit.
- 2. Select folder (1-4).
- 3. In Stop mode, press FORWARD

# **Advanced operation**

### EN: CAUTION

Tips: Cutting, inserting new segments and adding appendix will only update the recorded time length, without changing recording time and date.





# Troubleshooting tips

#### Unit doesn't turn on

- Check that batteries are properly inserted and not exhausted.
- Make sure battery compartment door is properly closed.
- Make sure LOCK function is not activated.

### Display keeps flashing when unit is off

• You may not have set the time. Refer to section on Time Setting.

#### **Cannot record**

- Make sure **LOCK** function is not activated.
- Make sure memory is not full.
- Check the total files in all folders not exceeding 200.
- You have recorded 99 files in one folder. Try record in a new folder.

## Cannot show recording date and time during playback

• You may have not set the date and time before recording. Refer to section 'Time Setting'.

## No sound from speaker during playback

- Make sure volume is not set to 0.
- Headphones should not be connected.

### **Cannot edit**

Make sure LOCK function is not activated.

## Cannot activate the unit after pressing on keys

There may be software problems.

Press and hold **RESET** to reset the unit.

#### Recordable time becomes shorter

 You may have set the recording quality to 'High Quality', refer to section 'Setting Recording Quality'.

### Cannot perform playback

- Make sure you have selected folder with recorded messages.
- Make sure **LOCK** function is not activated.

#### Cannot erase recorded file(s)

 Make sure you follow each step under section "Erasing Selected File" carefully.









# More information

#### EN. **Precautions for the Unit**

- Do not use the unit immediately after transportation from a cold place to a warm place; condensation problem may be resulted. Avoid shock to the unit especially
- during recording. Recorded data can be damaged.
- Do not store the unit near fire, places with high temperature or places with direct sunlight.
- Do not operate or store unit in places with frequent static electricity or electrical noise (e.g. speaker, TV set). Clean the unit with a soft cloth or a
- damp chamois leather. Never use
- The unit must only be opened by qualified personnel.
- Do not expose this appliance to rain or moisture.

### **Precautions for Batteries**

- If you do not use the unit for more than one month, be sure to remove the batteries to avoid leakage.
- When installing batteries, be sure that the polarities are correct. Reversing polarity may cause personal injury and damage to the batteries.
- Never mix new batteries with old ones. Do not mix battery types.
- Discard leaking batteries immediately. Leaking batteries can cause skin burns or other personal
