


Disc Function or Operation that is Not Available



Titles, Chapters and Tracks

- DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.
- Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song on an Audio CD.



Note : Numbers identify each title, chapter, and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers recorded on them, but some do not.

REMOTE CONTROL

Using the Remote Control

- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

To Install Batteries

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert two AAA batteries.



Battery Replacement


When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace them.

CAUTION: Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid corrosion damage caused by battery leakage.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.
- Always remove batteries as soon as they become weak.





REGION (LOCAL) NUMBER ERROR INDICATOR

If the region (local) number of the disc that you attempt to play differs from the region number of the Unit. "Disc region incorrect" appears on the TV screen. (The disc cannot be played).

CONNECTING THE FM ANTENNA WIRE

Connect the FM antenna wire to the FM antenna terminals. Fully unwind the antenna wire and position it for the best reception.




A.CONNECTING YOUR TV

The unit can be connected to your TV in several different ways, depending on the design of your TV.

RCA AUDIO/VIDEO JACKS

Use the Audio/Video cable (supplied). Connect the VIDEO OUT and left/right AUDIO OUT jacks on the unit to the VIDEO IN and left/right AUDIO IN jacks on your TV.

Note: If you only want sound to come from the speakers of the main unit do not connect the left/right AUDIO OUT jacks from the main unit to your TV.



or

Use the Audio/Video cable (supplied). Connect the VIDEO OUT and left/right AUDIO IN jacks on the unit to the VIDEO IN and left/right AUDIO OUT jacks on your TV.

Note: During DVD playback, the sound only comes from the speakers of the main unit.




COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT (DVD)

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with component video inputs.

Using an audio cable (not supplied), connect the left/right AUDIO OUT jacks on your unit to the left/right AUDIO IN jacks on your TV. Using a component video cable (not supplied), connect the Y VIDEO OUT jack (green plug) on your unit to the Y VIDEO IN jack on your TV, the PB VIDEO OUT jack (blue plug) on your unit to the PB VIDEO IN jack on your TV and the PR VIDEO OUT jack (red plug) on your unit to the PR VIDEO IN jack on your TV to view the highest quality picture playback.

PROGRESSIVE OUTPUTS (DVD)

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with Component Video inputs that are capable of reproducing a progressively scanned video signal.



Press the SETUP button and select Video Out to P-Scan (see page 20).

Make sure your TV can support a progressive scan component video signal.


- Connect the unit directly to your TV. If you connect the unit through a VCR, the playback picture will be distorted because DVDs are copy protected.
- When you connect the unit to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- Refer to the instruction manual of the connected equipment as well.

B. CONNECTING A VCR

- Using the supplied Audio/Video cable, connect the yellow plug from the VIDEO OUT jack on your unit to the VIDEO IN jack on your TV. Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT jacks on your unit to the AUDIO IN jacks on your TV. If you want the sound to come from the speakers of the main unit do not connect the left and right audio cable from the main unit to your TV.
- Using a video cable (not supplied), connect the VIDEO IN (VCR) jack on your unit to the VIDEO OUT jack on your VCR.
- 3. Using an audio cable (not supplied), connect the left/right AUDIO IN jacks on your unit to the AUDIO OUT jacks on your VCR.

WATCHING A VIDEOTAPE

- Turn on the unit. Use the FUNCTION button on the remote control or the front panel to select "AV IN".
- Turn on your TV and follow the instructions included with it to select the VIDEO function which corresponds to the VIDEO IN jack that is connected to the main unit.
- 3. Turn on the VCR and follow the instructions included with it to play the videotape.




C. CONNECTING OTHER EQUIPMENT (AMPLIFIER)

ANALOG CONNECTION

Using an audio cable (not supplied), connect the left/right AUDIO OUT jack on your unit to the AUDIO IN jack on your other source.

DIGITAL CONNECTION

Using a coaxial digital audio cable (not supplied), connect the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack on your unit to the DIGITAL AUDIO IN jack on your other source.




LISTENING TO ANOTHER AUDIO EQUIPMENT

- 1. Turn on the unit.
- Turn on your audio equipment and follow the instructions included with it to select the AUDIO IN or DIGITAL IN function.

Notes:


- When you connect the unit to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- If the external equipment is a television and this audio system is close to it, you may experience interference if the tuner function is selected while the television is working.
- If you have a stereo VCR, ensure you set it to STEREO mode.
- Due to copyright protection, DVD movies cannot be copied. If you copy a DVD movie onto a videotape, the resulting copy will be unclear, with poor sound quality. This is NOT caused by a defective DVD system.
- Refer to the instruction manual of the connected equipment as well.




D.CONNECTING THE SPEAKERS & SUBWOOFER

Plug the POSITIVE (+) and NEGATIVE (-) ends of each speaker wire into the corresponding jacks on the rear of the Unit, matching the color tube on the end of the speaker wire to the color-coded connector.

E. POSITIONING THE SPEAKERS AND SUBWOOFER





PLUGGING IN THE UNIT

- · Ensure all the components and speakers are connected correctly.
- TO PREVENT ELECTRICAL SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF WALL OUTLET, THEN FULLY INSERT.
- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect the power cord.

TURNING ON THE UNIT AND TV

When the unit is plugged in, it is in standby mode and the standby indicator lights up.

- 1) Press the U STANDBY/ON button to turn the unit on.
- 2) Turn on the TV by pressing its POWER button.
- 3) Select the channel on your TV corresponding to the VIDEO IN jack that the unit is connected to. See TV User Guide for more information.
- If you have connected the unit successfully, the DVD logo (start-up picture) will appear on your TV screen.

Notes :

- Whenever there is no disc in the unit or the disc has stopped playing for 60 minutes, the system will switch to STANDBY mode automatically.



CONNECTING EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT VIA THE AUX IN JACK

To listen to audio from external equipment, connect the plug to the AUX IN jack on the front panel. LISTENING TO THE CONNECTED EQUIPMENT

- 1. Press the FUNCTION button repeatedly to select AUX.
- 2. Play the external source.

SOUND SYSTEM

TO ADJUST THE SOUND BALANCE

Use the remote control to make the following changes to speaker balance:

LEFT SPEAKER

Press the SOUND button repeatedly to display " L ", then press the ▲ or ▼ button on the remote to
adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the unit.

RIGHT SPEAKER

• Press the SOUND button repeatedly to display " R ", then press the ▲ or ▼ button on the remote to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the unit.

SUBWOOFER

• Press the SOUND button repeatedly to display " 5₩", then press the ▲ or ▼ button on the remote to adjust the sound level. It will show on the display of the unit.

Note: If no button is pressed within a few seconds, the display will return to normal.

Dolby Digital (for DVD)

Dolby Digital is a technology developed by Dolby Laboratories. Soundtracks encoded in Dolby Digital can reproduce from one to 5.1 discrete channels of excellent quality audio.

The unit automatically recognizes the Dolby Digital bitstream and provides a downmix suitable for two-channel listening. An additional Dolby Digital decoder is required for reproduction of the discrete multichannel soundtracks available on many DVDs.

PLAYING A DISC

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. Such as, the unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" \mathbf{S} " may appear on the screen during operation. A " \mathbf{S} " means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

Playing a Disc

- 1. Press the U STANDBY/ON button turn on the unit.
- 2. Press the FUNCTION button to select DVD mode.
- See CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS before proceeding to step 3.
- **3.** Press the ▲ **OPEN/CLOSE** button. The disc tray opens.
- 4. Place a disc onto the disc tray with the label side up.
- Press the ▲ OPEN/CLOSE button. The disc tray closes. It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically bring you to the main menu of the DVD or start playback of the disc.
- 6. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ► PLAY button.

Pausing Playback (Still Mode)

Press the **II** PAUSE button on the remote. To resume normal playback, press the **▶ PLAY** button. Each time you press the **II** PAUSE button, the picture advances one frame.

Stopping Playback

Press the ■ **STOP** button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the ► **PLAY** button.

If you press the ■ **STOP** button twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and pressing the ► **PLAY** button will reset the disc to the beginning.

Skipping to a Different Chapter/Track

- Press the HA PREV button repeatedly to skip to the start of the current or previous chapter or track.
- Press the MEXT button to skip to the next chapter or track.
- For an audio CD, use the number buttons (remote control only) to go directly to that track number.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

- The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.
- Four speeds are available. Each time the ◀ TUNING ➡ button is pressed, the speed of fast scan changes in the following sequence:

2. Press the ► PLAY button when you have reached the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.

Notes:

- · The DVD player mutes sound during reverse and forward scan of the disc.
- The fast playback speed may differ depending on the disc.

Slow-motion Play

- 1. Press the IN SLOW button on the remote in play mode.
- Four speeds are available. Each time the ► SLOW button is pressed, the speed of slow-motion playback changes in the following sequence:

$$\downarrow 1/2 \qquad \downarrow 1/2 \longrightarrow \downarrow 1/4 \longrightarrow \downarrow 1/6 \longrightarrow \downarrow 1/8$$

2. Press the ► PLAY button to return to normal playback speed.

PLAYING A DISC

Angle Selection 🔎

Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of current angles available.
- 2. Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
 - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle selected.
 - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.

Notes:

- This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, " E111 " is displayed.

Subtitle Selection 🖉

- 1. While a DVD is playing, press the **SUBTITLE** button to display the current language setting, as shown in the example below.







PLAY MODES FOR CD OR JPEG DISC

When playing CD/JPEG discs, you can modify the Play Modes through the Toolkit which appears on the right side of the window. Press the \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright button on the remote control to navigate between the left/right windows and the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button on the remote control to select files/tracks or play mode items. Then press the **OK** button.

CD Track/JPEG File Programmed Playback

- 1. Use the ► and ▼ buttons to select "Edit mode" then press the OK button.
- Use the cursor buttons (◄, ►, ▲, ▼) to select tracks/files shown on the left side of the window. Then press the OK button. "✓" will appear in front of the selected tracks/files.

Note: It is disabled if the "Edit mode" item is not selected.







TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE

SYMPTOM	CAUSE (AND REMEDY)
No power.	Ensure the AC power cord is connected.
No picture	The region number of the disc doesn't match the region number of this unit.
	 The TV is not set to receive DVD signal output. The video cable is not connected. The TV is not turned on. Clean the disc.
The picture is not clear.	 If video from your system has to go through your VCR to get to your TV, the copy-protection applied to some DVD programs could affect picture quality. The disc is scratched. The DVD unit may be set to progressive scan; moreover, TV does not support progressive scan component video signal. Set the Video Out to "CVBS" mode. The location and orientation of the antenna are incorrect. If you use an indoor antenna, change to an outdoor antenna. The TV antenna wire is too close to the unit. Separate the TV antenna wire from the unit.
No sound or only a very low-level sound is heard.	 Ensure the speakers and equipment are connected securely. The system is in Pause mode or in Slow-motion Play mode. Press the ► PLAY button to return to normal play mode. Fast forward or fast reverse is performed. Press the ► PLAY button to return to normal play mode. Make sure the AUDIO output and AV IN input connections are correct. Adjust the speaker volume.
Severe hum or noise is heard.	 Ensure the speakers and equipment are connected securely. Ensure the connecting cords are away from a transformer or motor, and at least 10 feet (3 meters) away from a TV set or fluorescent light. Move your TV away from the audio equipment. The plugs and jacks are dirty. Wipe them with a cloth slightly moistened with alcohol. Clean the disc. Vibrations from the speakers are affecting the unit.
The remote does not function.	Remove any obstacles between the remote and the unit.Use the remote near the unit.Point the remote at the remote sensor on the unit.Replace the batteries in the remote.
The disc does not play.	 There is no disc inside ("No Disc" appears on the TV screen). Insert the disc correctly with the playback side facing down on the disc tray. Clean the disc. A non-VALID disc has been inserted. The unit and disc region number are incompatible.
The DVD door cannot open.	 Condensation may have formed inside the unit due to a sudden change in temperature. Wait approximately an hour for it to clear and try again.

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning the Disc

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.

- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example: heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.



Cleaning the Unit

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before cleaning the unit.
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly. Then wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust.

Important Note

Before transporting the unit, remove the disc from the disc compartment.
