



- 3. **Heed Warnings** All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. Follow Instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- Cleaning Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning. Do not apply pressure to the LCD screen. Excess pressure may damage the screen.

- 15. 





UNDER CABINET INSTALLATION



- 1) Choose an appropriate mounting location underneath a cabinet or shelf. Close proximity to an electrical outlet, TV antenna or cable connection and telephone jack will facilitate a neat, easy installation. Do not mount the VE920 above a range or oven. Be sure that the location chosen will provide adequate access to the electrical connections on the rear of the unit before continuing.
- 2) If the location chosen has a bottom edge molding it may be necessary to use the mounting spacers provided to effectively lower the VE920 below or even with the molding. Measure the distance between the edge molding and the bottom of the cabinet. The spacers and mounting holes are stepped to achieve different mounting heights from .5" to 1". Adjusting the mounting height is done by lifting and rotating the spacer in the mounting hole. Choose a spacer height, which will allow the VE920 to clear the edge molding.
- 3) Measure the thickness of the bottom of the cabinet or shelf and the spacer height chosen. Select the shortest screw length, which will secure the VE920 to the bottom of the cabinet.
- 4) Cut out the template supplied and tape it in place onto the cabinet surface to be drilled. Center punch the four holes indicated on the template and remove the template.
- 5) Carefully drill four 1/8" holes at the locations marked above.
- 6) Connect your TV antenna or cable system to the antenna connector on the rear of the VE920.
- 7) Attach the FM Dipole Antenna and position the antenna for the best reception.
- 8) Attach the AM Antenna and position the antenna for the best reception.
- 9) Position the VE920 and mount it in place using the selected screws. **NOTE:** Do not over-tighten.
- 10) Plug the AC power cable into the wall outlet. Route the wires safely away from heat and moisture sources.


COUNTERTOP/DESKTOP INSTALLATION



NOTE: Use caution to avoid damaging the LCD screen and the main unit when converting this unit from an under-counter unit to a countertop unit. Leave the protective plastic on the screen until this procedure is completed.

- 1) Place the unit (with the screen facing up) on a soft padded surface.
- 2) Pivot the screen so that it is perpendicular to the front of the unit and then turn it sideways.
- 3) Remove the hinge guide covers (#1) using a flat blade screwdriver inserted into the removal slots. Unscrew the mounting screws (#2). Remove the connector from the unit (#3), be careful not to damage the screen (#5) or wires.
- 4) Turn the unit over and remove the blank cover (#4)
- 5) Connect the plug of the LCD monitor into the connector (#3). **NOTE:** Align the "L" and "R" stamped on the screen-mounting bracket with the "L" and "R" molded into the connector housing.
- Replace the screws and slide the hinge guide covers onto the unit, be careful to not damage the wires. **NOTE**: Do not over-tighten.
- 7) Insert the rubber pieces (#6) (Foot, Mounting Cap please refer to the illustration above) into the unit. Install the blank cover on the unused port.

FRONT PANEL CONTROLS




- 1) **ON/OFF BUTTON** Power ON/OFF and Standby Condition(Time Display).
- 2) SET BUTTON Press this button to set the TIME, ALARM, TV Mode or Speaker Mode.
- 3) **TEL BUTTON** Selects the Hands-free speakerphone function.
- 4) SOURCE BUTTON Selects the TV, FM, AM, AV1, AV2 and DVD functional modes.
- 5) **T/F BUTTON** Selects Clock Mode When playing a DVD (MP3, CDDA).
- 6) **CALL BUTTON** Press the CALL button to call another station.
- 7) TALK BUTTON To answer from a station that was called, press the TALK button and keep it pressed while talking.
 - * CALL and TALK buttons are working while Intercom function is selected.
- 8) **INT BUTTON** Selects the Intercom function.
- 9) MUTE BUTTON Press this button to mute the audio (++++ will appear and blink on the display when the system is muted).
- 10) P4 BUTTON Selected Preset Channel "4" in the Radio or TV mode. Stop and Eject (press and hold) button in DVD play mode.
- P3 BUTTON Selected Preset Channel "3" in the Radio or TV mode.
 Next button in DVD play mode.
- 12) **P2 BUTTON** Selected Preset Channel "2" in the Radio or TV mode. Play/Pause button in DVD play mode.
- 13) **P1 BUTTON** Selected Preset Channel "1" in the Radio or TV mode.

 Previous button in DVD play mode.


- 14) **VOLUME UP (▶) BUTTON** Press this button to raise the volume.
- 15) **VOLUME DOWN (◄) BUTTON** Press this button to lower the volume.
- 16) **SEEK BUTTONS (▼▲-Right Side)** Press these buttons to go to next available channel with sufficient signal strength.
- 17) CHANNEL BUTTONS (▼▲-Left Side) Press these buttons to go to next available channel.
- 18) **DISPLAY WINDOW** Displays the channel/station number, time, and selected source.
- 19) **REMOTE INFRARED SENSORS** These sensors receive infrared command signals from the hand held remote control unit.
- 20) MICROPHONE Used for hands-free speakerphone operation.
- 21) SCREEN LOCK BUTTON Used to lock screen in place.
- 22) Disc Insertion Slot
- 23) Contrast Control Used this control to adjust the contrast.
- 24) Color Control Used this control to adjust the color.
- 25) Brightness Control Used this control to adjust the brightness.

REAR PANEL CONNECTIONS




- 1) AC LINE CORD Connects to AC outlet
- AUDIO LINE OUT Connect to low-level input of stereo system or low-level input of computer speaker
- 3) **SPEAKER OUT TERMINAL** Connect to external speakers (min. 8ohms)
- 4) **FM ANTENNA** Allows the **VE920** to be connected to a 75-Ohm external antenna for the reception of FM broadcast signals.
- 5) AM ANTENNA Allows the VE920 to be connected to an external antenna for the reception of AM broadcast signals.
- A/V (AUDIO/VIDEO) INPUT CONNECTORS Connect to A/V OUTPUT of a VCR or Camcorder.
- TV ANTENNA (75 OHM ANTENNA CONNECTOR) -Allows the VE920 to be connected to a 75-ohm external coaxial antenna or cable TV system.
- 8) **TEL JACK** Connect to telephone jack (not supplied) for hands-free speakerphone.

DVD REMOTE FUNCTION

- (1) **EJECT**: Press this button to Eject and Load the disc tray.
- (2) DVD: Press this button to select DVD mode of operation.
- (4) SETUP: Displays setup menu for initial user settings.
- (5) SEEK DN/UP (21) CH+/-: For selecting item on menu.
- (6) MENU: For displaying the menu contained in the disc. (PBC ON/OFF Function VCD)
- (7) **FR** (◀**◄**): Fast reverse (2X, 4X, 8X, and 20X).
- (8) STOP (■): Press this button to stop disc playback(1 time) Stop at the present playing point / (2 times) Stop playing
- (9) **PREV** (I◀◀): For skipping to the next or previous chapter or track.
- (10) Digit 0~9 Select: For direct selecting a chapter (or tack) and for password input.
- (11) TITLE: For displaying the title menu contained in the disc.
- (12) DISPLAY: For checking the current disc status.
- (13) SUBTITLE: For selecting the subtitle language
- (14) AUDIO: For selecting the audio language.
- (15) SCREEN: Press this button to change Display Mode. Push the SCREEN Button to enlarge the screen. The screen will be enlarged in the following order:

```
TV MODE: Normal (default) -> Full

AV, DVD MODE: Full (default) -> Normal

CDDA, MP3: Full (default) -> Normal -> LCD MONITOR OFF
```

- (16) **ANGLE**: If a DVD disc contains sequences recorded from different camera angles you can change the camera angle for playback.
- (17) **ON/OFF**: Press this button to turn power ON and OFF.
- (22) ENTER: Press this button will cause the chapter (or track) change to occur immediately.
- (23) MUTE: Press this button to remove all sound (++++ blanks on display window).
- (24) **FF** (◀**◄**): Fast Forward (2X, 4X, 8X, and 20X).
- (25) **SF** (**I**▶): Slow Play (1/2, 1/4, 1/6, 1/7) speed in forward.
- (26) **NEXT** (▶▶I): For skipping to the next chapter or track.
- (27) PLAY/PAUSE (▶II): Start disc playback or Pauses disc play.
- (28) VOL +/-: Use these buttons to increase or decrease the volume level.
- (29) SEARCH: Allows a search to a desired Chapter/Title/Song/etc.
- (30) **REPEAT**: For repeated playback of disc title, chapter/track.
- (31) A-B: For specifying and repeating playback of a section of the disc.
- (32) ZOOM: For magnifying the screen (1, 2, 3 or OFF).
- (34) STEP: Play forward each time button is pressed.

TV REMOTE FUNCTION

- (3) TV: Press this button to select TV mode of operation.
- (5) **SEEK DN/UP**: Use these buttons to advance to the next higher or lower station.
- (10) **0~9**: Use these buttons to make a direct channel selection
- (15) SCREEN: Press this button to change Display Mode.
- (16) AP (Auto Program): Press this button for 0.5sec to program and save all the stations on memory.
- (21) CH+/-: Use these buttons to advance to the next higher or lower channel.
- (23) MUTE: Press this button to remove all sound (++++ blinks on display window)
- (28) VOL+/-: Use these buttons to increase or decrease the volume.
- (33) Delete: Use to remove selected channel from memory.
- (34) Step (Add): Use to add a selected channel to memory.

RADIO REMOTE FUNCTION

- (5) SEEK DN/UP: Use these buttons to advance to the next higher or lower station.
- (19) **AM/FM**: Each time this button is pressed, the VE920 will alternate between AM and FM radio bands.
- (21) CH +/-: Use these buttons to advance to the next higher or lower channel.
- (23) MUTE: Press this button to mute the sound (++++ blinks on display window).
- (28) VOL+/-: Use these buttons to increase or decrease the volume.

MISC REMOTE FUNCTION

- (20) **TEL**: Press this button to answer an incoming call, press again to hang up the speakerphone. (The VE920 contains a hands-free speakerphone).
- (18) A/V: Press this button to select external A/V source 1 or 2.

OPERATION

INITIAL SETUP

This unit defaults to cable TV mode. When the unit is first powered on, it will detect the cable system and auto-program the TV tuner to the available stations. Please wait while the unit auto-programs before attempting to operate the unit. During this time the unit will not respond to any commands. The unit will respond normally once the cable mode and channel search mode is concluded.

CHANNEL TUNING SETUP

If you are Cable TV subscriber, in addition to normal broadcast reception of VHF and UHF channels, your new TV is capable of receiving many unscrambled Cable channels without the use of a converter box. When set to broadcast (AIR) TV, it receives CH2-CH69. When set to one of the CATV modes (STD, HRC, or IRC) it receives CH1-CH125. **NOTE**: Most cable companies broadcast in STD Mode

After a power interruption, the unit will go into a cable mode search (HRC, IRC, STD) and channel search mode automatically. During this time the unit will not respond to any commands. The unit will respond normally once the cable mode and channel search mode is concluded.

POSITIONING THE SCREEN

Press the screen lock button and pivot the screen forward until a comfortable viewing angle is reached. The screen may also be rotated from side to side. Do not force the screen beyond its rotational limit. The VE920 is now ready for use.

Pressing the ON/OFF button on the unit or the remote will turn the system on or off. Remember to turn the unit off and pivot the screen to the closed position when not in use to prevent damage to the screen.

SETTING THE TIME

NOTE: All settings (except setting the presets) are performed with the VE920 turned OFF.

- 1) Press the SET button and the minutes will flash.
- 2) Use the CH up/down button to set the minutes.
- 3) Press the SEEK button to toggle between the hour and minutes.
- 4) Use the CH up/down button to set the hour. (Check AM/PM indicator)
- 5) Press the ON/OFF button to return to the time display.

SETTING and ACTIVATING the ALARM

NOTE: The VE920 must be turned "OFF" when performing the following procedure.

1) Press the SET button twice to enter the alarm mode, press the P3 button to toggle between the active and deactivated mode.

NOTE: If a series of dashes appear (--: --), the Alarm is DEACTIVATED.

- 2) Press the CH up/down buttons to set the desired hour/minute. When setting the alarm, check the AM/PM indicator to assure the proper setting.
- 3) Press the SEEK buttons to toggle between the hours and minutes.
- 4) Press the ON/OFF button. The alarm is now set and activated. Once the alarm is set it will sound each day at the same time as long as it is activated.

DEACTIVATING ALARM

- 1) Press the SET button twice to enter the alarm mode.
- 2) Press the P3 button once. The set time will disappear from the Display Window and a series of dashes (--: --) will appear, Alarm DEACTIVATED mode.
- 3) Press the ON/OFF button. The alarm is now deactivated.

NOTE: The set time will be stored in memory and can be reactivated whenever desired by performing step 1) – 3) of the ACTIVATING ALARM procedure.

SETTING THE ALARM TONES

- 1) Press the SET button twice (power off).
- 2) Press the P4 button once to hear the alarm tone.

NOTE: Alarm must be in the "Activated" mode to hear tones.

- 3) Each time CH UP/DOWN button(s) is pressed it will select a different alarm tone.
- 4) Press the ON/OFF button to confirm the selected tone.
- 5) When the alarm sounds, press the ON/OFF button to turn it off.

SETTING THE ALARM VOLUME

- 1) Power OFF
- 2) Press the SET button twice for the Alarm setting mode.
- 3) To select alarm tone, Press "P4" button and press volume UP/DOWN for your desired volume level. Then, press "SET" button for volume setting

SETTING THE CABLE TV MODE

- 1) Press the SET button three times to enter the TV/Cable configuration mode.
- 2) CABLE or AIR will appear on the display.
- 3) Press the SEEK button to select Cable mode.
- 4) Press the CH UP/DOWN button(s) to select the desired cable mode (STD/IRC/HRC).
- 5) When the desired mode is reached, press the ON/OFF button to confirm.

SETTING THE AIR TV MODE

- 1) Press the SET button three times to enter the TV/Cable configuration mode.
- 2) Press the SEEK button to select the AIR mode.
- 3) Press the ON/OFF button to confirm.

SETTING THE SPEAKER MODE

- 1) With power off, press the SET button four times to enter the speaker configuration mode. "ISP (or ESP)" appears on the VFD.
- 2) Press the seek button to toggle between the "I SP" and "E SP"
- 3) When the desired mode is reached, press the ON/OFF button.

SETTING THE INTERCOM MODE

- 4) With power off, press the SET button five times to enter the intercom configuration mode. "Int On (or Int OFF)" appears on the VFD.
- 5) Press the seek button to toggle between the "Int On" and "Int OFF"
- 6) When the desired mode is reached, press the ON/OFF button.
 - * Int OFF: default, No response to call signal.

SETTING THE PRESETS (IN AM, FM OR TV MODES)

- 1) Tune to the desired channel/station.
- 2) Press the SET button and the display flashes.
- 3) Press desired preset (P1, P2, P3 & P4) to confirm the selection.

NOTE: you can preset 4- AM, 4- FM and 4- TV Programs

USING THE DVD PLAYER

Inserting and Ejecting the Disc

- 1. Set the unit to DVD mode (press source button until (-----) appears on the display.
- 2. Insert the disc with the label facing up.
- 3. The disc will begin playing automatically. If this is a DVD it will go to the DVD menu. Press the PLAY button to begin watching the movie.
- 4. To eject the disc, press and hold the ▲/■ button. The disc will eject.
 - * Discs playable through DVD player DVD, CD, CD-RW with MP3.

Playback and Stop

- To temporarily stop playback, press the STOP button once. The player memorizes the exact
 position where it was stopped, and it will resume playback again from that position. When it
 is desired to playback from the beginning, press the STOP button twice.
- 2. To Playback again, Press the PLAY (▶II) button.
 - * For some VCDs, stop mode is possible by pressing the NEXT button.

Searching for a Specific Scene/song by Selecting the Chapter Number

- 1. Pressing the SEARCH button once will display the Time / Title / Chapter input screen.
- 2. Input the chapter number or time that is desired and press the ENTER button. The player will commence play from the chapter number or time that that was entered.

Searching for a Specific Scene/song by using Chapters

- The player will automatically change to the next or previous chapter from the current chapter being played when the PREV (I◄◄)/NEXT (▶►I) button is pressed.
- 2. Pressing PREV (I◄◄) will change the player to the chapter previous to the chapter currently being played.
- 3. The chapter change status is displayed on the upper part of the screen.
 - * While playing MP3 discs, PREV (I◄◄)/NEXT (▶▶I) button to select the previous or next song. When the MP3 disc is stopped, Press CH+/- button to select the song.

Searching for a Specific Scene/song by Playback Speed

- 1. Search by Fast Forward (▶▶) and Fast Reverse (◀◀).
- 2. Search by Slow Forward (I▶)
- 3. Search by watching one scene at a time. Press the PLAY/PAUSE (▶II) button.
 - * For normal speed playback, press the PLAY (>) button.

Repetitive Playback -To Repeat a Specific Section

- Press the REPEAT button once to enable the REPEAT selection screen, follow by pressing the REPEAT button till REPEAT CHAPTER is displayed, the current chapter or track will be replayed repetitively (CHPTER REPEAT ON).
- 2. Repeat step 1 till REPEAT TITLE is displayed on the screen, the currently playing title or CD will be played repetitively (TITLE REPEAT ON).
- 3. Repeat step 1 till OFF is displayed on the screen, the repeat function will be turned off (REPEAT OFF).
 - * In case of the MP3 disc, Press the REPEAT button to change the PLAY MODE

Repetitive Playback -To Repeat a Specific Section(A-B Repeat)

- 1. Choose the section to be repeated by pressing the A-B button once (SET A).
- 2. Press the A-B button again to choose the finishing part of the section. (SET B)
- 3. Press the button until OFF is displayed on the screen this will turn off the repetitive function.(A TO B OFF)

Changing the Subtitle Language

- 1. If the disc contains caption data, press the SUBTITLE button to choose a specific language. (e.g., 1/3 ENG, 2/3 SPA, 3/3 FRE will be displayed on the screen)
- 2. SUBTITLE OFF shows that there are no subtitles.
 - * This function may not be incorporated in some disc titles

Changing the Vocal Language (AUDIO)

- 1. If the disc contains different audio tracks, press the AUDIO button to choose between the various spoken languages (e.g., 1/4 5.1ch ENG, 2/4 2ch ENG, 3/4 2ch ENG, 3/4 2ch ENG).
 - * This function may not be incorporated in some disc titles

ZOOM (To Enlarge a Picture)

- 1. Pressing the ZOOM button allows the picture to be enlarged by X1, X2 or X3.
- Navigation buttons (Seek DN/Seek UP/ Ch UP/Ch DN) allow the enlarged picture to be shifted
- 3. To resume normal settings, press the ZOOM button again until ZOOM is OFF.

Viewing Different Angles

Angle indicator appears on the upper part of the LCD display. When the Angle indicator appears, press the ANGLE button to view the screen from various angles.

* This function may not be incorporated in some titles.


Viewing the Main Disc Menu

A DVD is divided into sections called titles and chapters. When you play a DVD, a root menu of the disc will appear on the screen of your Monitor. Contents of the menu will vary depending on the disc content. Press MENU during playback to display the main menu. Some DVDs only allow you to select disc playback options using the DVD root menu

- 1. A menu installed in discs appears when pressing the MENU button. The menu must be previously saved in the disc.
- 2. Use the navigation buttons to select the desired item on the menu and press ENTER button
- * The TITLE button instead of the MENU button, depending on the type of disc being played

Viewing the Playback Time, Title and Chapter Status

- 1. Pressing the DISPLAY button will allow the user to see the title and chapter number, and the elapsed time of the currently playing disc on the upper part of the screen, show the remaining time of the current title, show the elapsed time of the current chapter, show the remaining time of the current chapter.
- 2. Pressing the button once again will turn the display OFF.



During playback press DISPLAY to display the current disc playback information. Press display again to remove the display.



- 3. Playing time of the disc.
- 4. Remaining time of the disc.



USING THE REPEAT FEATURE

The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. Pressing REPEAT consecutively changes the repeat options:

- · Repeat Single- repeats the track that is playing.
- · Repeat All- repeats the disc that is playing.
- OFF


As you toggle through the options, the repeat option changes. The selected repeat option loops repeatedly until its turned off.

PLAYING MP3 DISCS

MP3 is a digital audio format. An audio CD-quality song is compressed into the MP3 format with no significant loss of audio quality. CD-R/RW discs that have been encoded in MP3 format are compatible with this device.

Insert an MP3 Disc, the DVD player will initialize the disc and the directory (folder) will be shown on the monitor screen.

When an MP3 disc is inserted into the unit, the menu screen appears automatically. You can use the menu screen to change folders and songs. The system plays the songs in the order they were recorded onto the disc.



- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to choose a folder from the folder list on the left side of the screen.
- 2. Press ENTER to select the highlighted folder. All songs available under the selected folder will be listed.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to choose a song from the list, then press ENTER to play the selected song.
- 4. To move back up to the previous folder use the ▲ button to highlight the the top of the screen, make sure that the disc is paused and press ENTER.

Use the NEXT ($\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright I$) button to move to the next song. Press the PREVIOUS ($I \blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleleft$) button to move to the previous song.

USING THE REPEAT FEATURE

The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. Pressing REPEAT consecutively changes the repeat options:

- · Repeat Single (repeat playback of a song)
- Repeat All (repeat playback of all folder)
- Off (normal playback)

Pressing REPEAT a 3rd time will resume normal playback. As you toggle through the options, the repeat option changes. Selected repeat option loops repeatedly until you turn it off.

NOTE: During MP3 playback, you cannot access "PLAY MODE", folders or songs. The unit must be stopped to access these.

PLAYING A JPEG FILE

- 1. Insert the JPEG Disc into tray.
- 2. Select JPEG file by pressing the "UP/DOWN" button.
- 3. You can preview the JPEG file by pressing "Play" or "ENTER".
- 4. Pressing the left or right button will rotate the JPEG in that direction.
- 5. When browsing the photos, you can reverse the photo horizontally by pressing the "Up" button, or you can reverse the photos vertically by pressing the "Down" button.
- 6. You can return the root Menu by pressing "MENU" key.

SETUP

The setup menu allows the user to select the play mode settings. Follow the basic steps below for each setup menu selection.

The following options are available when in SETUP mode.

OSD Menu: Use to select DVD Setup Menu Language (ENGLISH - Default).

Subtitle: Select a language for subtitles (disc dependent).

ENGLISH (Default), FRENCH, SPANISH, CHINESE.

OFF: No subtitles are displayed.

Audio: Select a language for audio (where available - language depend on disc).

ENGLISH (Default), FRENCH, SPANISH, CHINESE.

DVD Menu: (where available - language depend on disc).



- * **16:9** : When the player is connected to a wide screen TV, a wide picture is shown on the full screen(Default).

Rating Menu

Press the SETUP button to display the main menu (see sample screen under LANGUAGE Menu)

Use to select parental Rating:





CHANGE PASSWORD & RATING

- 1. Select Rating by ◀ or ▶ buttons and press ENTER to enter the Rating setup page
- 2. Enter the current password and press ENTER button (unlock).
- 3. Select Rating by ▼ button and press ENTER button to enter the sub-menu.
- 4. Select the rating level you desire by repeatedly pressing the ENTER button.
- 5. Select password by ▲ button and input either the default password or any new 4-digit password and press ENTER button (locked).
- 6. Press SETUP button.

NOTE: The Default Password is 3308. This password is always effective even after you have selected your own password and changed it. To avoid the possibility of others using the default password to set the parental level and change the password, you can record this default password in another area and delete it from this manual. Some discs can be limited depending on the age of users while some discs cannot.

Load Factory

To restore all of the options to the default settings select 'LOAD FACTORY' using the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown buttons and press ENTER. This will return all of the settings except for parental to the

default settings.
